Cravens Scholarship Recipients Announced

Five graduating seniors from the class of 2009 have been awarded the Cravens Youth Scholarship.

They were chosen from a group of applicants who submitted essays entitled "What My Church Means to Me". The essays were judged by a panel of seven who do not know the identities of the authors beforehand. For the third time, the committee also awarded an "Outreach Scholarship" to Jon Green. Jon, an honor student, has completed his first year college at the University of Texas at Dallas and is a member of Webb Chapel United Methodist Church.

The scholarships are awarded in memory of Tom Cravens who served the youth at First United Methodist Church-Coppell as a Sunday School Teacher, UMYF Youth Counselor and Confirmation Leader and Mentor. Prior to his death in 2000, he expressed a desire that a fund be established to assist youth with costs of higher education not based on class rank, athletic ability or other activities. Instead he wished that a student be recognized for his or her ability to communicate their faith through the written word and how it would help them in their spiritual journey after high school. Tom's love for youth was also matched by his love for the game of golf. It is fitting that the "Cravens Scholarship Fund" is the beneficiary of the **FUMC Annual Golf Tournament** played in October of each year.

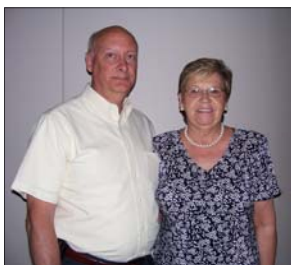
